Island of Rockall Act 1972

1972 CHAPTER 2

An Act to make provision for the incorporation of that part of Her Majesty's Dominions known as the Island of Rockall into that part of the United Kingdom known as Scotland, and for purposes connected therewith. [10th February 1972]

E IT ENACTED by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. As from the date of the passing of this Act, the Island of Incorporation Rockall (of which possession was formally taken in the name of Rockall of Her Majesty on 18th September 1955 in pursuance of a Royal kingdom as Warrant dated 14th September 1955 addressed to the Captain part of the of Her Majesty's Ship Vidal) shall be incorporated into that County of part of the United Kingdom known as Scotland and shall form Inverness. part of the District of Harris in the County of Inverness, and the law of Scotland shall apply accordingly.

2. This Act may be cited as the Island of Rockall Act 1972. Short title.

Article 5 – Normal baseline

Except where otherwise provided in this Convention, the normal baseline for measuring the breadth of the territorial sea is the low-waterline along the coast as marked on large-scale charts officially recognised by the coastal State

The Government, in exercise of the power conferred on them by section 13 of the Maritime Jurisdiction Act, 1959 (No. 22 of 1959), hereby order as follows:

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Maritime Jurisdiction Act, 1959 (Charts) Order, 1959.
- 2. Charts published at the Admiralty, London, shall be charts for the purposes of section 13 of the Maritime Jurisdiction Act, 1959.



EXPLANATORY NOTE.

The purpose of the Order is to prescribe charts to be used in evidence for the purposes of establishing matters relating to the territorial seas, the exclusive fishery limits and other matters arising under the Maritime Jurisdiction Act, 1959.

Article 121 – Regime of islands

- 1. An island is a naturally formed area of land, surrounded by water, which is above water at high tide
- 2. Except as provided for in paragraph 3, the territorial sea, the contiguous zone, the exclusive economic zone and the continental shelf of an island are determined in accordance with the provisions of this Convention applicable to other land territory
- Rocks which cannot sustain human habitation or economic life of their own shall have no exclusive economic zone or continental shelf








Coral 1.505 meters above MSL.



Note the white guano on the rock indicating that it is above water at all times.




Nicaragua - Honduras







Position of the Cays




Cays in relation to reefs




12M from reef edge





Cays in relation to reefs
